Pastor's Note

Advent is upon us! The stores and advertisements have all moved on to Christmas morning and the gift-giving, commercial part of Christmas. As Christians, Advent slows down the season for us, and reminds us of the importance of anticipation – of waiting – for Christ's birth. The four weeks of Advent have themes important to our spiritual journeys – hope, peace, joy and love. Let's walk this important four week journey together, in our worship, in our personal prayer journey and in our lives, slowing down the process and being reminded of the simplicity of Christmas.

Advent/Christmas decorating & breakfast

We will gather Saturday morning, December 2nd to decorate the church for the season. The men's group will provide breakfast, the worship committee and DWF will provide the decorations, and we will all provide the labor! Breakfast will begin at 8:30 and decorating will begin by 9. Please join us for the time together as we prepare our church home for the season.

Blue Christmas Advent Service - Sunday December 17th - 3pm

Christmas is known as a season of joy, and it is definitely that with the birth of our Savior. Yet, the Christmas season can also stir up feelings of grief, loss and sadness for a variety of reasons. Our capacity for sadness is as much a part of how we were created as is our capacity for joy – and we are also created with the ability to hold those feelings together in concert with each other by allowing both to have the space needed within our soul. The Blue Christmas service is also called the Longest Night service, and is designed to give space for the feelings of sadness that we may feel during this season. The service will be brief, hopefully meaningful, and honors the whole person as we continue our Advent journey together. This is also a good opportunity to invite someone who may have experienced a recent loss.
